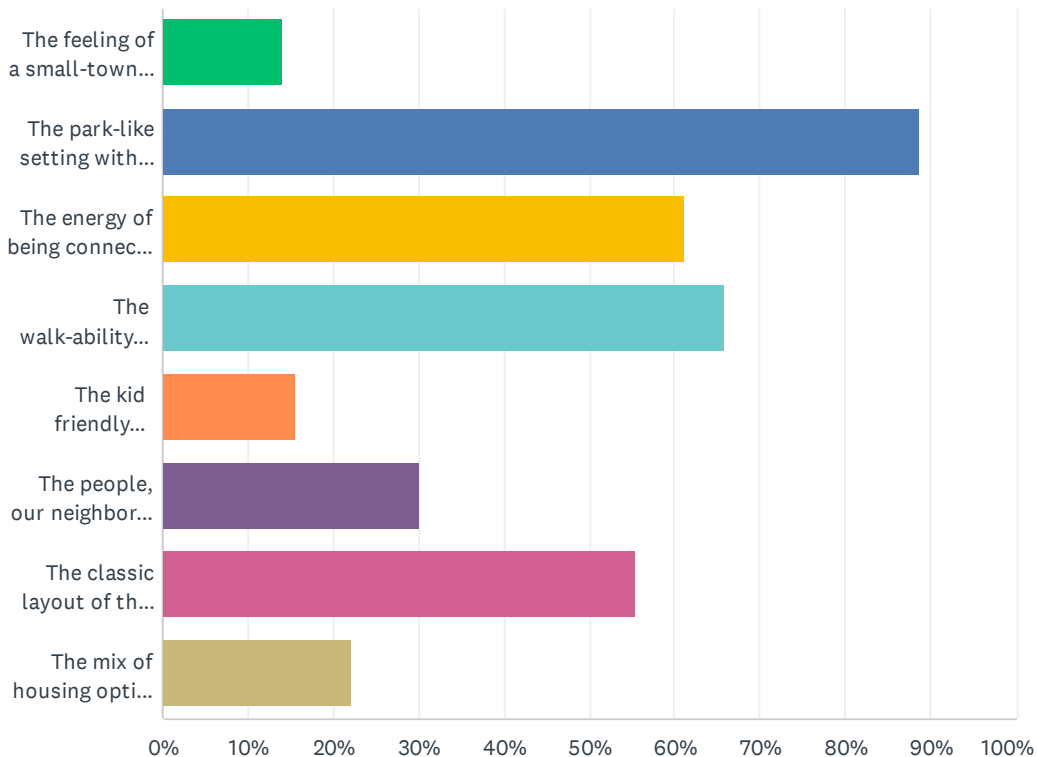


# Q1 What do you like most about living in Ansley Park? Choose up to four from this list.

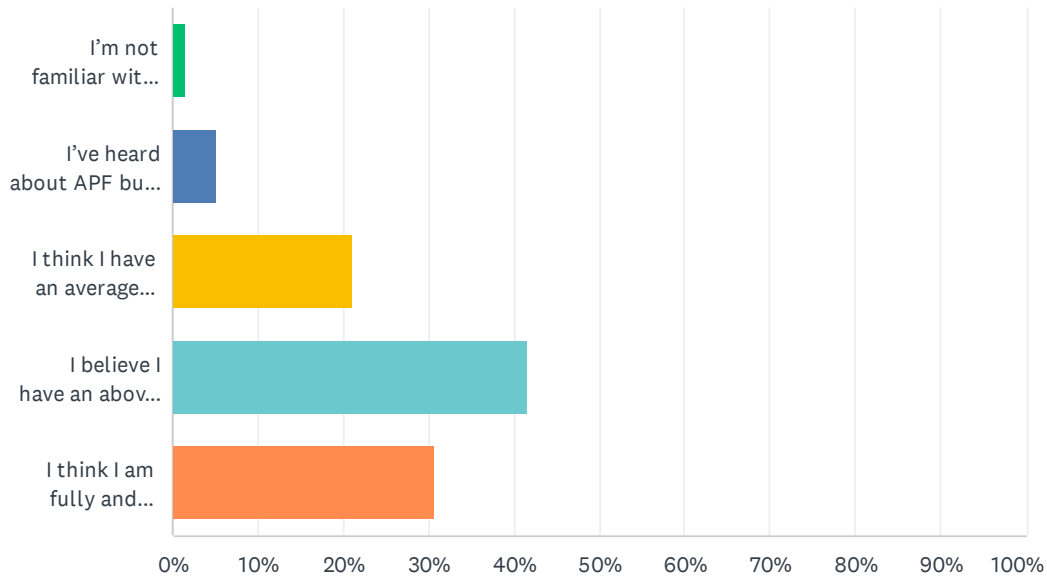

## Q2 How familiar are you with the work our neighbors at Ansley Park Forever (APF) are doing? Select the response which best describes your level of knowledge.

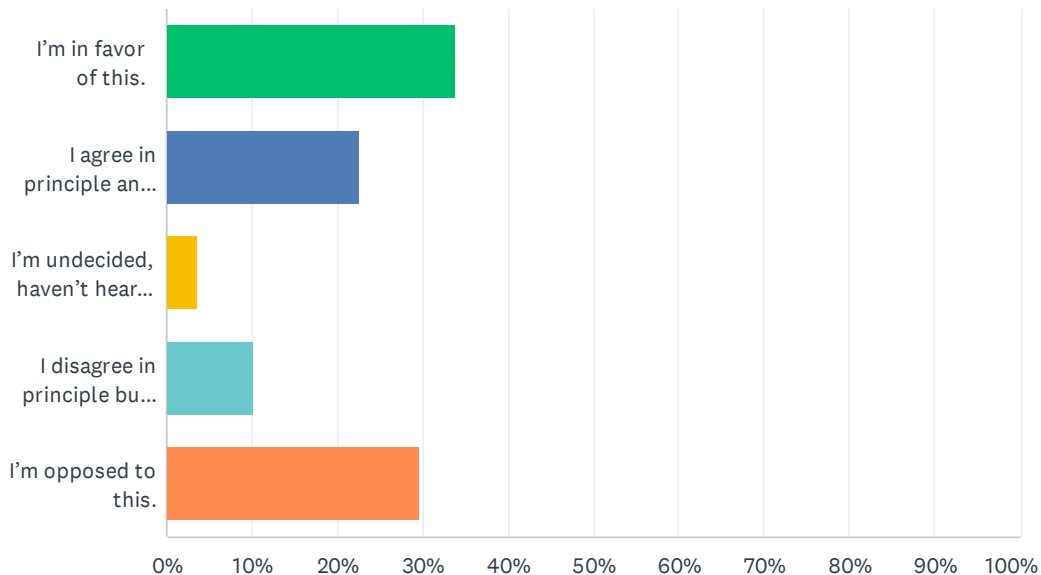

### Q3 Based on what you know today, how do you feel about Ansley Park being designated by the City as a Historic District?

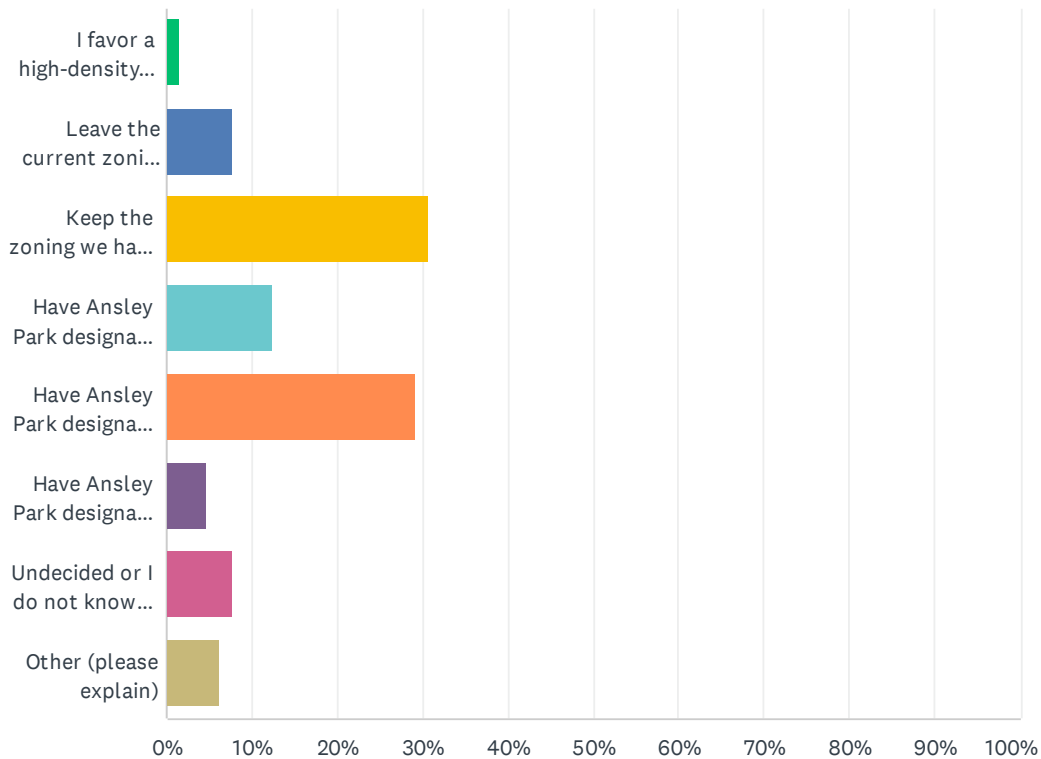

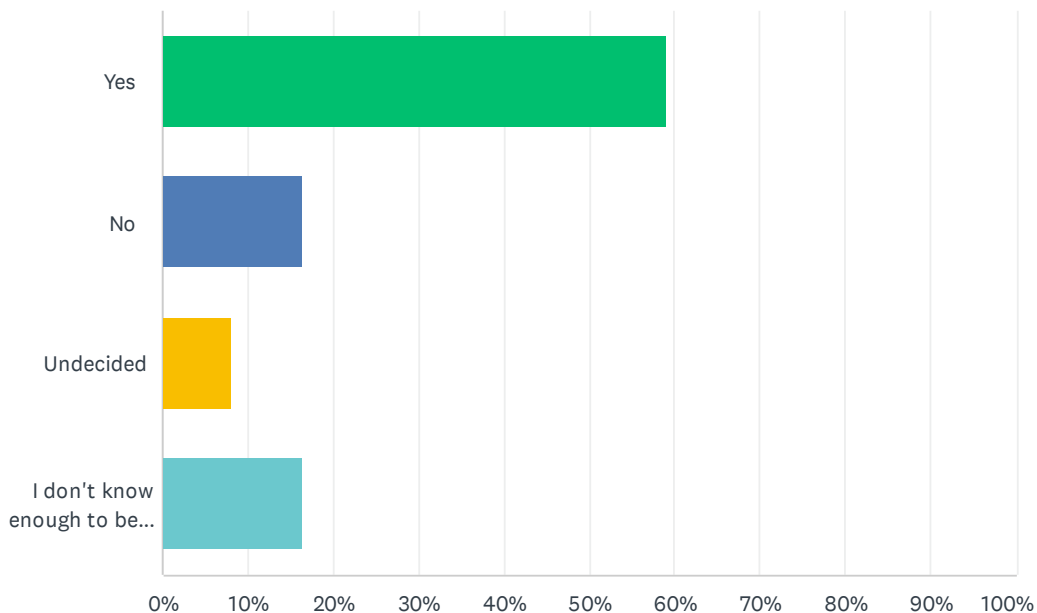


## Neighbor Feedback Poll May 2022

ANSWER CHOICES	RESPONSES	
I favor a high-density model that favors multi-family over single family residences within ½ mile of a rapid transit station.	1.54%	3
Leave the current zoning in place for now and let the City modify Ansley Parks zoning, as needed, to accommodate the changing needs of our City.	7.69%	15
Keep the zoning we have and hire a professional to fight inappropriate zoning variances and to fight changes in zoning that the City introduces.	30.77%	60

## Q5 Are you concerned about the way the City enforces the current Zoning ordinances, including the approval of variances?

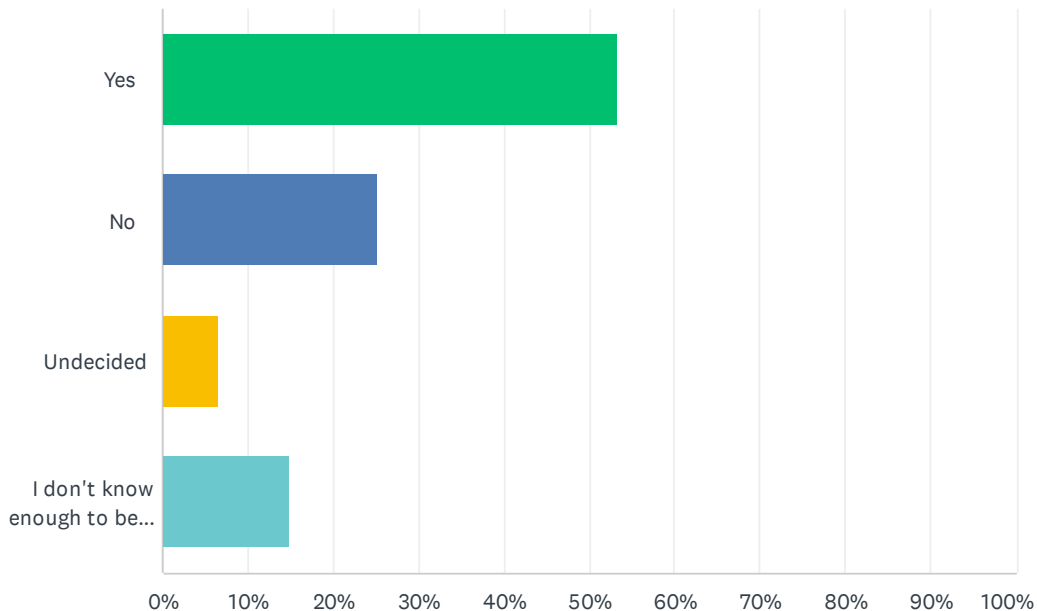

### Q6 Are you concerned about the way the City enforces the current Tree ordinances, including the fines levied?

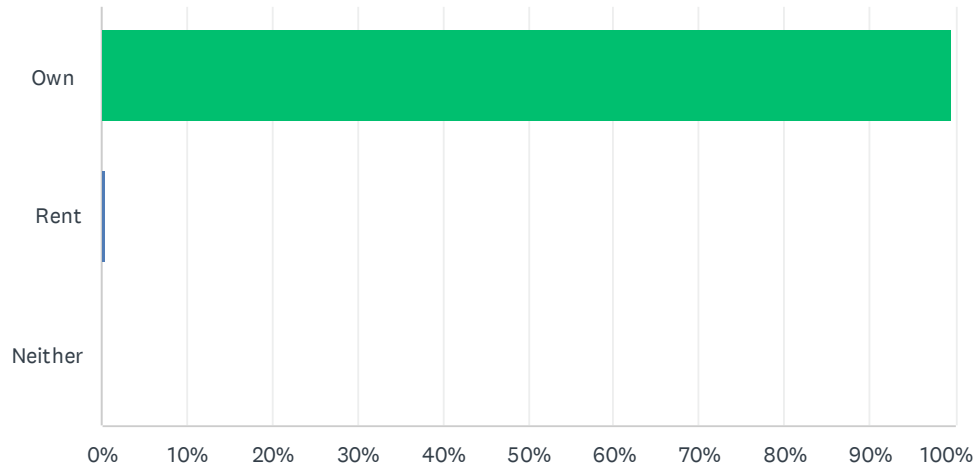

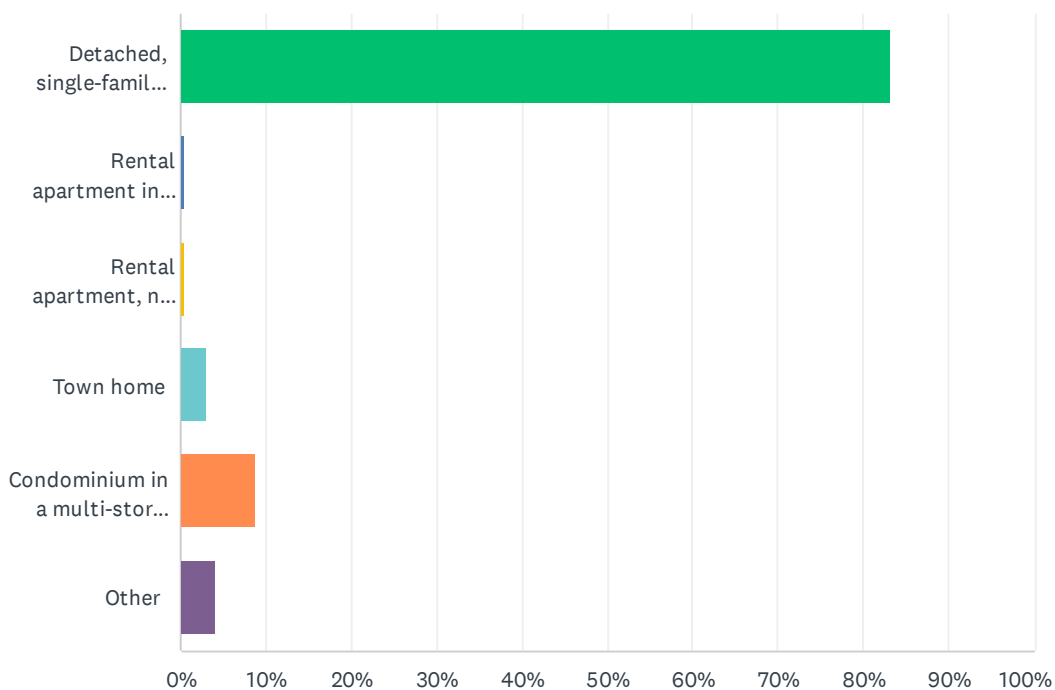

## Q8 Which of these best describes where you live in Ansley Park?

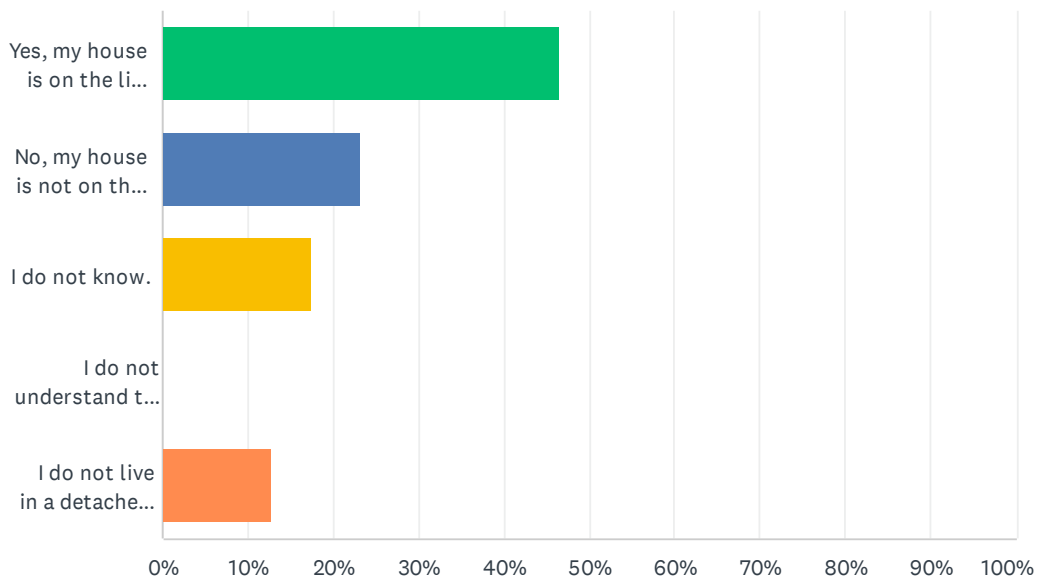
